Media around the UK:

The fostering network has seen coverage from well over 50 fostering services so far, and the cuttings keep pouring in. Events around the UK:

Foster carers in London have been celebrating today at an event held by Mayor Boris Johnson at City Hall. Meanwhile in Northern Ireland, Foster Carers of the Year have been announced. And across the whole of the UK, fostering services have been holding a wide range of events to raise awareness of the need for more foster carers.

Some fostering services are out and about touring their local areas spreading the word about fostering. The fostering network have heard from Bath and North East Somerset, Northamptonshire, Wokingham and Staffordshire with their specially named "Reggie the Recruitment Van". Independent agency PACT has set itself the challenge of meeting all

the mayors across Berkshire, Buckinghamshire and Oxfordshire, to get them to support the need for more foster families.

On Wednesday, all five health and social care trusts in Northern Ireland held Care for Coffee - 15 simultaneous coffee mornings for prospective foster carers.

Sports teams have again been supporting *Foster Care Fortnight*, with St Mirren, MK Dons, Glasgow Tigers and Gloucestershire Cricket Club all backing their local campaigns.

The arts haven't been missed out either: Suffolk kicked off *Foster Care Fortnight* with the launch of a new fostering film, while Northamptonshire has released a special song, *Fostering the Future*.

Birmingham city centre was taken over last Friday by a zumbathon – sounds painful!
